

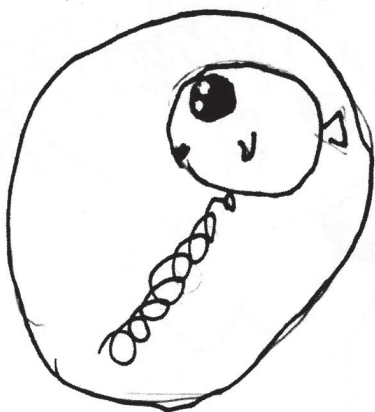

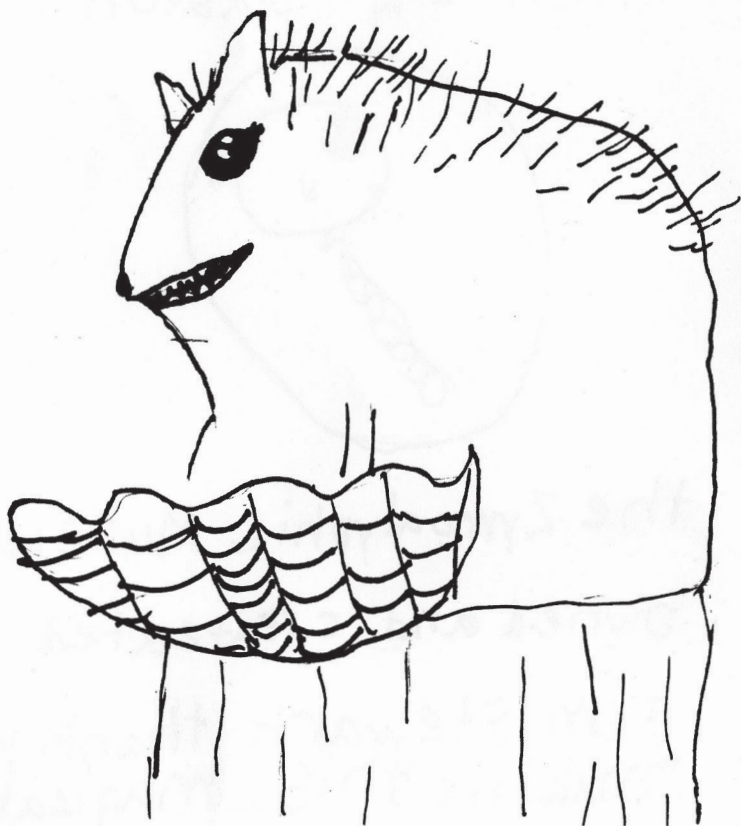

the Eyeball

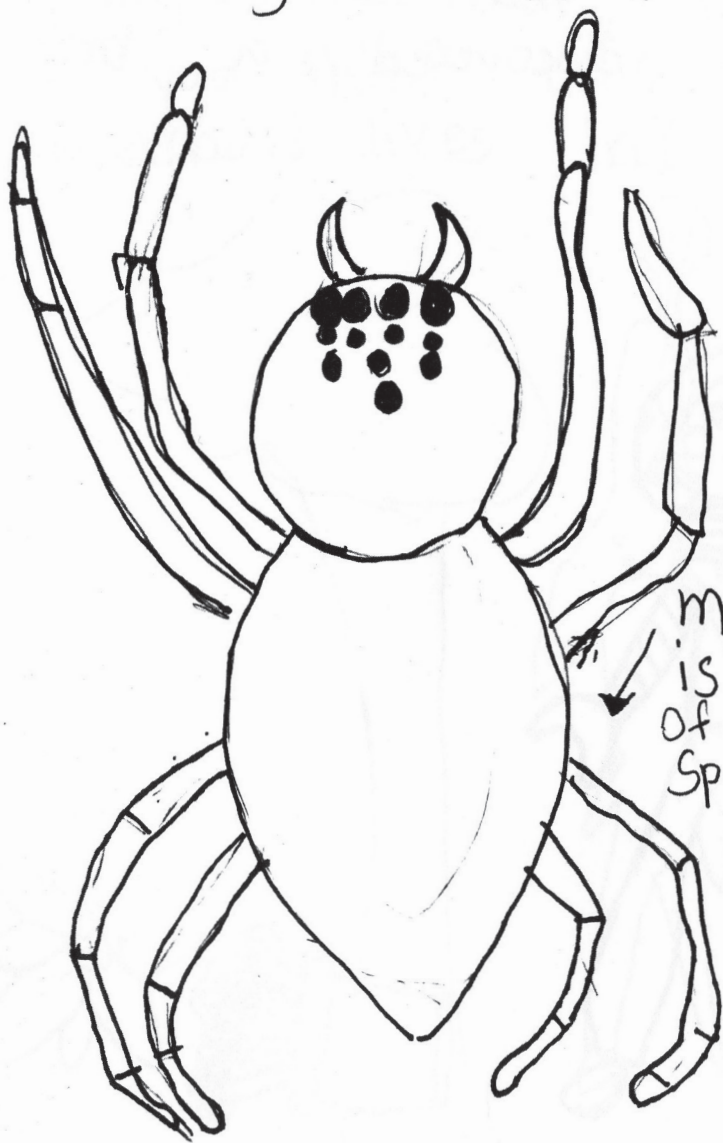
Carrot was created

it is laughable.

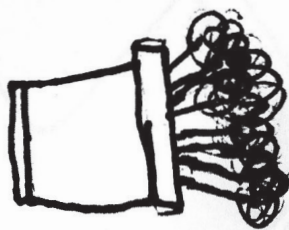


This is a Tarantula molt (skin).

Spiders!

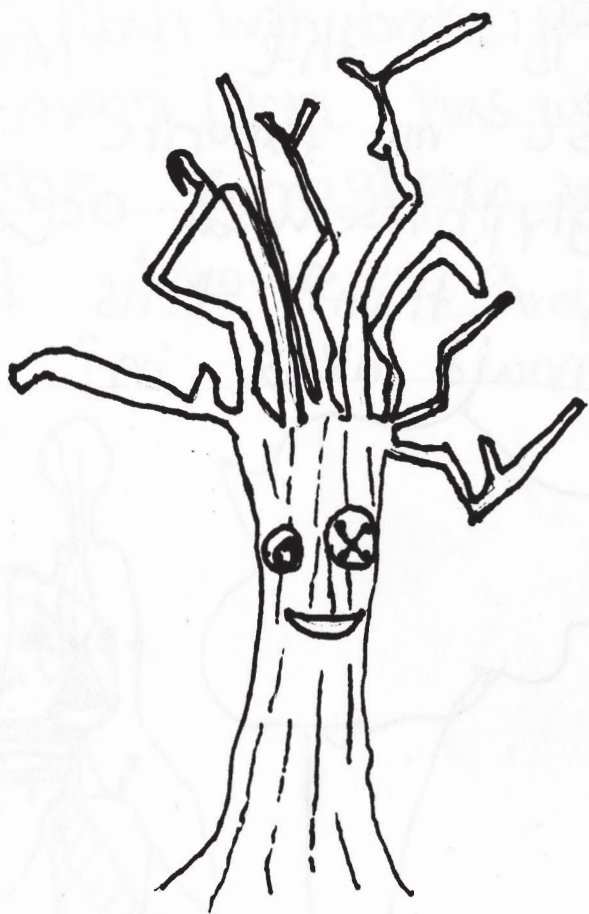
Moon Man with broken pot.
